Lesson title: Business Plans
Name: Kim Perry
Subject area: Business
Grade level: 9-12
Time frame: 7 Days

## Brief lesson/unit Summary/Description

Students have been studying the concepts of entrepreneurship and forms of business ownership. Students are introduced to business plans and given a business plan format to follow. They are then put into groups and each group will come up with a different type of business they wish to open. They will then follow the steps in creating a business plan for that type of business, and then create a Power Point presentation to present their business plan to the class. The class will decide which group should receive the investment money to start their business.

### Students will understand (lesson/unit objectives):

Students will be able to identify all the various aspects involved in opening a business and creating a basic business plan. Students will also be able to create a visual component of their business plan which they will present in a professional manner.

### Essential Questions to guide this unit/lesson and focus teaching and learning:

What is the purpose of a Business Plan? How much planning, organizing, and financing does it take to start a business? What are the best ways to present a business plan to potential investors?

### Technology & Web 2.0 resources needed (hardware and software, websites)

MS Word, Power Point or Prezi, loopnet.com, mapquest.com, and various other sites needed for research.

## Procedure (learning activities)/ lessons of unit

- 1. Students will read about Entrepreneurship and learn the different types of business ownership.
- 2. Students will watch a documentary called "How I made my millions" about successful start up companies.
- 3. Students will learn what a business plan is, what it is for, and the different parts of a plan.
- 4. Students will be put into teams of 3-4 and will choose a type of business they wish to open.
- 5. Over 5 days, students will be creating plans for their business using various resources off of the Internet.
- 6. Students will first create a formal business plan paper, typed on MS Word.
- 7. Students will then turn their paper into a presentation, using either Power Point or Prezi.
- 8. Students will present their business plans to the class.

#### **Assessment Method**

The projects will be assessed using a rubric. There is a separate rubric for the groups to follow for both the paper itself and then for the presentation. One group will receive the "Investment."
